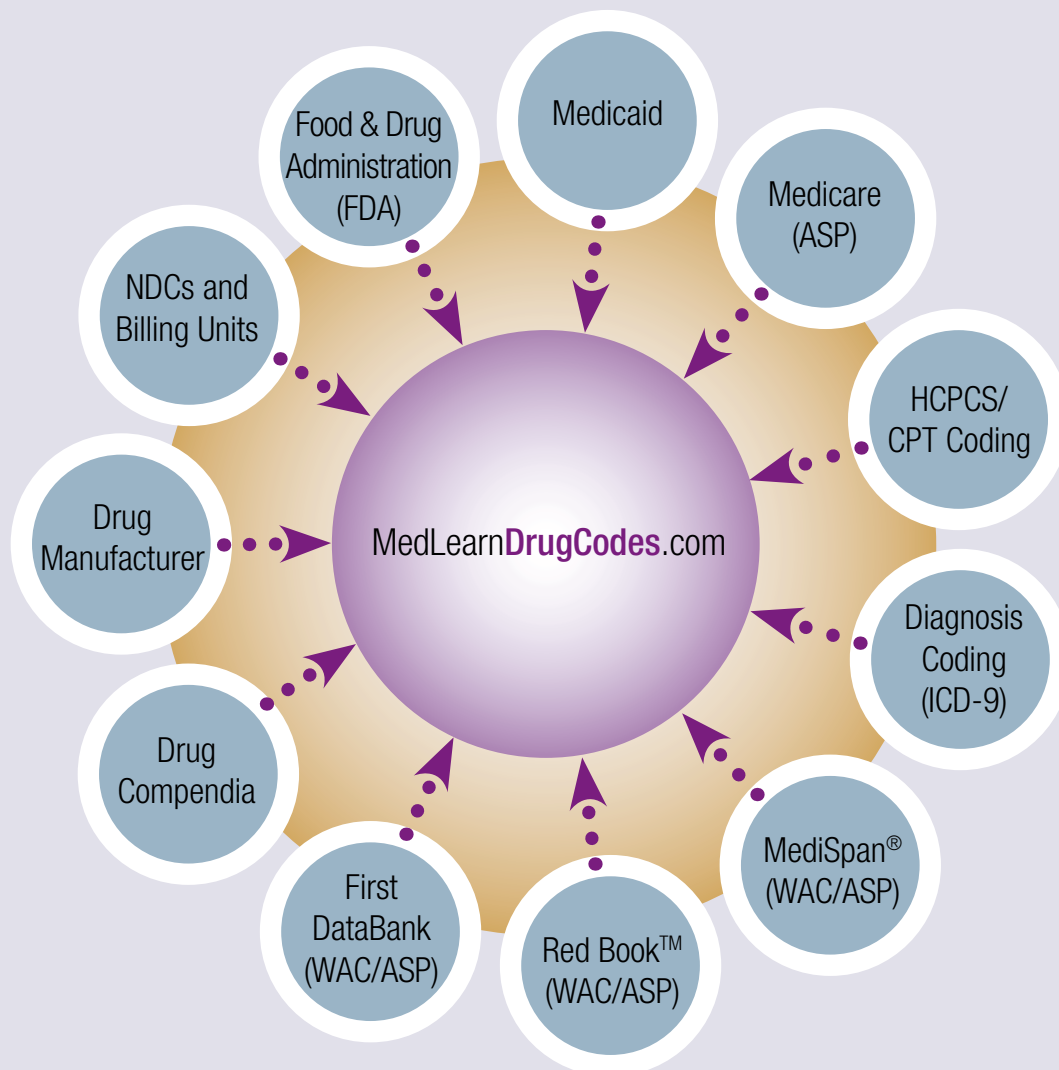

Gross revenues for outpatient infusion services are hitting projected growth targets, but net reimbursement appears to be significantly below forecasts.
